THE OHIO AGRICULTURAL HALL OF FAME

This second enshrinement places the portraits of three additional outstanding agriculturalists in the Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame.

This is the highest recognition Ohio can possibly offer to her leading agriculturalists.

Additional numbers will be added to the Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame each year. Members are selected by a panel of judges from nominations submitted by anyone who wishes to provide such recognition to an outstanding individual.

The number of awards in any year may not exceed four—two from the category of farmer or breeder and two from agricultural-related activity.

MR. CARL R. ARNOLD

The late Carl R. Arnold was born in Oregon, but moved to a farm near Arcanum, Ohio in 1908. A graduate of The Ohio State University, he received his bachelor of science degree in 1920.

Arnold was an expert in farm finance and helped organize the Farm Credit Administration. He was a member of the Department of Agricultural Economics at The Ohio State University from 1920 to 1933. In 1933 he became Deputy Commissioner of Production Credit in the Farm Credit Administration at Washington. He held this position until 1940 when he was named Commissioner. He retired to the home farm in 1951.

In 1953 he was recalled to Washington by President Eisenhower to serve as Governor of the Farm Credit Administration.



MR. DAVID W. GALEHOUSE

Galehouse, who is now 91, has been active in seed production, soil conservation work and many other farm activities. He has been in the Certified Seed business for 51 years and was one of the first 10 in the State to grow Hybrid Seed Corn. On two different occasions he was President of the Ohio Seed Improvement Association.

A 1901 graduate of the College of Agriculture at Ohio State University, he taught short courses in agronomy for a time and did extension work in agronomy. In 1915 he was appointed Mahoning County Extension Agent—the sixth in the state.

Returning to the home farm in 1918, he started the Wayne County Farm Bureau and was Assistant to the Director on Farmers' Institute work. He was also President of Marshallville Equity, and a Director of the Wayne County Fair Board. For nearly 50 years he was a Farmers' Institute Speaker.



DR. HARRY C. RAMSOWER

Dr. Harry C. Ramsower, Director Emeritus of the Ohio Cooperative Extension Service. Born on a farm in Licking County, he graduated from the College of Agriculture at Ohio State University in 1906.

He was the first chairman of the Department of Agricultural Engineering at the University. On January 1, 1920 he became the Director of the Cooperative Extension Service and held that position until his retirement in 1948.

He served on many national extension and educational committees and during World War II he served on the Advisory Committee to the Council for National Defense.

Since his retirement in 1948 he has served in a number of capacities which have brought him international recognition.
