AgVenture Magazine

OAC publishes and distributes this award-winning agricultural publication to nearly 7,000 fourth grade teachers and reaches more than 190,000 fourth graders in Ohio at the cost of mere pennies per issue. *AgVenture* promotes Ohio agriculture emphasizing the importance of food, fiber, floriculture and nursery production, processing and distribution in Ohio.

COSI (Center of Science and Industry), Columbus, Ohio

OAC provided leadership and funding for two interactive agricultural experiences at COSI. "The Big Yummy" is an animatronic musical variety show starring various food characters who teach COSI visitors about the importance of food sources, nutrition and safety. Additionally, "Bet the Farm," Web site allows COSI's on site and cyber guests to explore the business of agriculture.

Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame

Created by the Ohio Agricultural Council in 1966, the Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame has now honored nearly 190 agriculturists who have dedicated their lives of outstanding work to Ohio's number one industry — agriculture.

Member Meetings

Held two to three times per year, full of variety, with educational and entertaining guest speakers, the Council's meetings are frequently at field locations such as Scott's, OSU, Ohio Stadium and other venues of interest. OAC meetings are open to members and guests.

Agricultural Hall of Fame

Enshrinement in the Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame is Ohio's highest recognition of an individual who has made outstanding contributions to the agricultural industry. Each year four prominent agricultural leaders are honored and inducted into the Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame for their superior service, dedication, leadership and plentiful contributions to agriculture.

Nomination and Selection Process

Persons wishing to nominate an individual who he or she believes is deserving of consideration for induction into the Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame may secure a nomination form through any Ohio Agricultural Council member or write to the Ohio Agricultural Council, Jane Scott, 232 Overbrook Dr., Columbus, Ohio 43214. Nominations must be submitted by March 15, 2008, in order to be eligible for consideration in 2008.

The selection process is such that members of the Hall of Fame committee appoint three individuals to a selection committee. In order to retain the high degree of integrity, the identity of the members of the selection committee is kept in confidence and precautions are taken to avoid the possibility of an individual serving on the selection committee more than one time.

2007 Honorees

Ohio Columbus Barber



Ohio Columbus (O.C.) Barber, (1841-1920) a pioneer in Ohio agriculture, was one of the first in the United States to apply scientific and business practices to agriculture. Between 1909 and 1912, he erected 35 permanent stone and brick farm buildings in the Beaux Arts style of architecture on the Anna Dean Farm, near Barberton, Ohio. These buildings joined the 67 existing wooden structures that spread out over 3,500 acres. The Anna Dean Farms set world records in 1915 with one Guernsey cow producing 24,008 pounds of milk, with 4.5% butter fat. The farm included 30,000 hens, 50,000 ducks and separate departments for swine, pedigree dogs and Belgian stallion horses. His farm also included oats, corn for silage,

hay and a wide variety of flowers, vegetables and fruits. He employed two Mennonite brothers named Yoder who worked with him in the greenhouse business. That business is now well known as the Yoder Brothers, one of the world's largest rooted and unrooted cuttings for the floral industry.

He also founded the city of Barberton, Ohio, a number of industrial companies such as the Diamond Match Company, the Diamond Rubber Company (later merged with B.F. Goodrich) and the original Akron City Hospital.

Amazingly, he started the Anna Dean Farm operation after his retirement at the age of 65 and devoted his last 24 years to the farm and the promotion of agriculture in the U.S.

Linus "Lenny" B. Losh



Linus "Lenny" Losh is known for his lifelong work in Soil and Water Conservation Services stretching from 1948 to 2000. His work began with SCS helping farmers plan and apply soil conservation practices. In 1955 he moved to the Ohio State SCS office, serving as Chief Economist and Head of Ohio's Watershed Planning Party. During this time, he developed the majority of Ohio's watershed plans. From 1963-1980, Losh served SCS in Washington, D.C., with responsibilities that included Ohio and other corn belt states.

During his tenure in Washington, Losh helped develop the Resource Conservation Act, and the regulations for implementation.

As the chief of the SCS Inventory and Evaluation Section, Losh developed the National Resource Inventory (NRI), which remains the federal government's principle source of information of soil, water and related resources on non-federal lands in the U.S.

From 1999-2000, Losh worked with the Ohio Department of Agriculture to analyze and develop agricultural policy. Recently, he has provided leadership to the Darby Creek Watershed Plan. He also helped secure \$150 Million in funding for the Scioto River Watershed Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program.

A native of Logan County, he graduated from Lakewood High School, and holds B.S. and M.S. degrees in agronomy from The Ohio State University.

Losh and his wife Jeanette live in Westerville and have two adult children, Clifford and Lynnette (Losh) Eisentrout.

Tom Price



Tom Price is a hog, cattle and compost farmer who has actively worked with agricultural related organizations and agencies to help livestock and poultry producers be good neighbors and environmental stewards, exemplified in the Price Farm mission: "We recycle food and fiber from the surrounding community of neighbors and businesses."

Price's enterprise – Price Farms Organics, Ltd. allows his farm operations to flourish in a rapidly urbanizing area while at the same time meeting the yard trimming disposal needs of Delaware County.

A native of Scioto County, Price is a 1960 graduate of Scioto Valley High School and holds a B.S. in agriculture from The

Ohio State University.

Price successfully blends farming, community and business, having served on the Delaware Area Chamber of Commerce and the Delaware Soil and Water Conservation District. He has served on the Ohio Pork Industry Strategic Planning Committee, the Ohio Beef Council, OSU Extension Advisory Committee and the Delaware Farmland Preservation Task Force. Currently he serves on the Ohio Soil and Water Conservation Commission and the Ohio Exposition Commission.

These industries have honored him with the Ohio Conservation Farm Family Award, Ohio Cattlemen's Environmental Stewardship Award, Ohio Pork Producers Service Award among many others.

Bobby D. VanStavern



Dr. Bobby VanStavern is an icon in the Ohio and United States beef industry. His vision and appreciation for the factors that effect beef palatability led to the eight, science-based specifications for the "Certified Angus Beef" (registered trademark) (CAB brand, the nation's first specification-based, branded beef program). VanStavern's specifications for CAB brands became the benchmark for premium beef, and for 30 years, have led it to be the world's first and largest fresh beef brand, selling more than 500 million pounds worldwide.

A native of Union, West Virginia, he graduated from Union High School and went on to earn a B.S. from West Virginia University and an M.S. and Ph.D. from The Ohio State University in animal science.

After a two year stint in the US Air Force, VanStavern began his career at the Ohio Research & Development Center. He was a catalyst in the consumer-driven marketplace, where producers came to realize they are in the beef business, and packers could separate products into specific markets.

VanStavern has served the industry at nearly every level: American Society of Animal Science, American Meat Association and the Ohio Extension Professors Association, just to name a few. These organizations have honored him with numerous awards from the beef, pork, sheep and breed organizations.

VanStavern and his wife Sue live in Columbus and have two adult children, Jan and Tom.

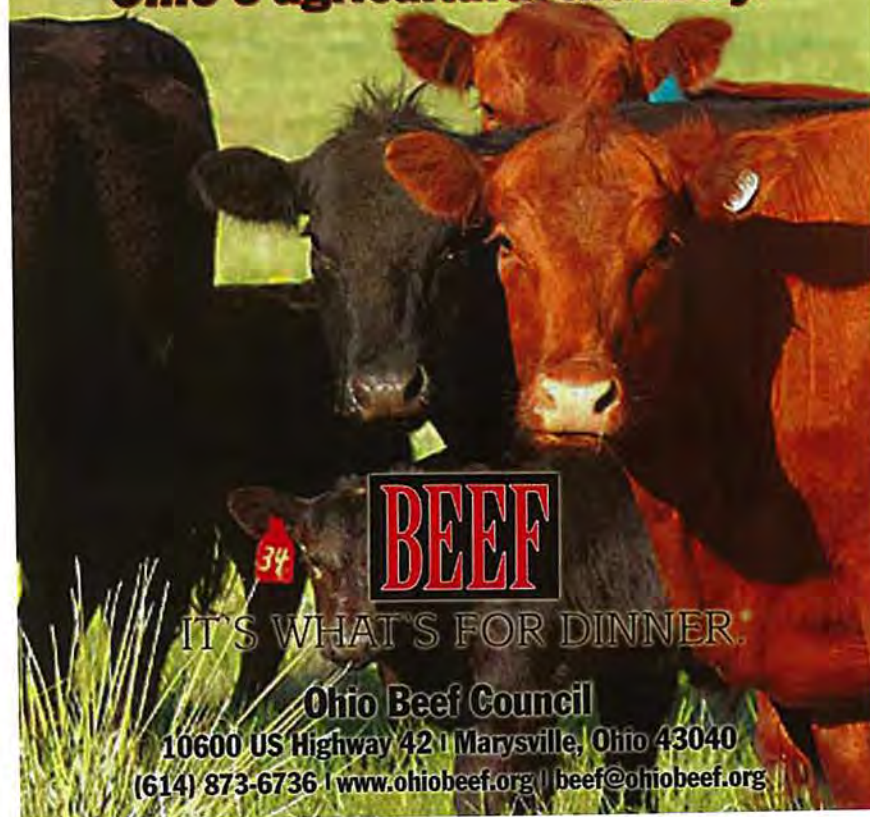

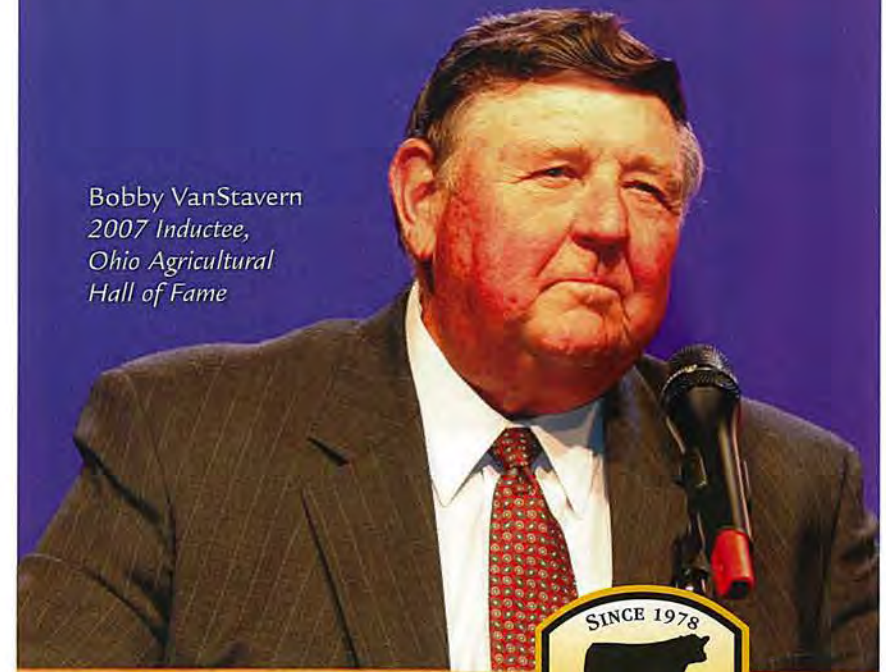
