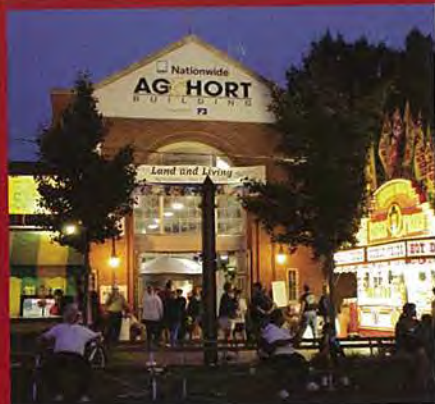

OAC Programming Efforts

Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame

Created by the Ohio Agricultural Council in 1966, the Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame has now honored more than 180 agriculturists who have dedicated their lives of outstanding work to Ohio's number one industry — agriculture.

Member Meetings

Held two to three times per year, full of variety, with educational and entertaining guest speakers, the Council's meetings are frequently at field locations such as Scott's, OSU, Ohio Stadium and other venues of interest. OAC meetings are open to members and guests.

Ohio License Plate

The "Ohio Agriculture" license plate is now available for purchase at your local Bureau of Motor Vehicles. The plate was established under HB 293 which was sponsored by Rep. Bruce Goodwin of Defiance.

The cost of the plate is an additional \$30. Funds from the "Ohio Agriculture" license plate will be used for scholarships for students studying agriculture or a related field at an Ohio institution of higher learning. The scholarship funds will be disbursed by a board made up of representatives from the Ohio agriculture industry including: a representative from the Ohio Department of Agriculture, the Ohio Agricultural Council, the Ohio Corn Growers Association, the Ohio Farm Bureau Federation, the Ohio Soybean Association, the Ohio Young Farmers Association and The Ohio State University, College of Food, Agricultural & Environmental Sciences.

Agricultural Hall of Fame

Enshrinement in the Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame is Ohio's highest recognition of an individual who has made outstanding contributions to the agricultural industry. Each year four prominent agricultural leaders are honored and inducted into the Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame for their superior service, dedication, leadership and plentiful contributions to agriculture.

Nomination and Selection Process

Persons wishing to nominate an individual who he or she believes is deserving of consideration for induction into the Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame may secure a nomination form through any Ohio Agricultural Council member or write to the Ohio Agricultural Council, 5950 Sharon Woods Blvd, Columbus Ohio 43229. Nominations must be submitted by March 15, 2009, in order to be eligible for consideration in 2009.

The selection process is such that members of the Hall of Fame committee appoint three individuals to a selection committee. In order to retain the high degree of integrity, the identity of the members of the selection committee is kept in confidence and precautions are taken to avoid the possibility of an individual serving on the selection committee more than one time.

2008 Honorees

R. Craig Fendrick



R. Craig Fendrick spent his entire career with The Ohio State University and the Farm Science Review, beginning as a student assistant in 1966, manager in 1981 and retired in 2003. He developed the Molly Caren Agricultural Center (MCAC) in 1982 for the first show at the new location in 1983. Exhibitor numbers grew from approximately 350 to 600 at the MCAC, and attendance grew from 80,000 to 145,000. The FSR is recognized by the industry as one of the top five farm shows in North America. He served two customers — the farmers of Ohio and the agricultural industry.

His work with FSR created a marketing venue for agriculture, as well as an educational venue as he collaborated with OSU faculty and staff.

He is an outstanding leader as he continues to lead the North American Farm Show Council, an association of 26 farm shows across the United States, Canada and New Zealand. He also continues to serve as a consultant to the College of FAES.

Craig has received commendations from the State of Ohio Governor's and General Assembly, as well as the OSU Board of Trustees. The headquarters at FSR has officially been named the Fendrick Headquarters Building. He was inducted into the FSR Hall of Fame in 2004.

He has been active in the Worthington United Methodist Church, Ohio FFA Foundation, National Agri-Marketing Association and the Columbus Tractor Club.

He and his wife Karen, reside in Sunbury. They have three children, Lyle, Lee and Lori.

James R. Helt



James R. Helt has served OSU Extension for 46 years in many ways, however his most meaningful contributions have been to the 4-H Youth Development program and "making the best better."

Jim served as the Assistant Director for 4-H Youth Development from 1989-1993, when he retired. During his leadership as the assistant director, 4-H membership increased from 166,000 to 205,000 members. He initiated the first Inner City 4-H programs in Cincinnati, the first "Youth-at-Risk" 4-H programs in Circleville, trained more than 2,100 volunteers in six years with a 4-H Volunteer

Advisory training package that he initiated and developed, and developed and conducted the first area 4-H Horse Clinic that continues to be a popular program.

Since his retirement, Jim has been one of the most active supporters for Ohio 4-H International Programs and 4-H Teen Leadership programs. He currently serves as a Development Officer for the College of FAES and was an integral part of the fundraising efforts for the Nationwide and Ohio Farm Bureau 4-H Youth Development Center, where the center-top deck was named in his honor.

He has served as president of the Ohio Cooperative Extension Agents Association, Ohio Extension Professors Association and Epsilon Sigma Phi, as well as Gamma Sigma Delta. Jim has been inducted into the Ohio State Fair Hall of Fame and the Ohio 4-H Hall of Fame.

Jim and his wife Marlene live in Mt. Gilead. They have two children, Randy and Alan.

Donald H. Schriver



Donald H. Schriver has served the agricultural industry with great energy and vision for more than three decades as a communicator and cooperative leader.

Don served as the CEO of Milk Marketing, Inc., Ohio's largest milk marketing cooperative. During his time with MMI, he challenged the industry to create a new future for milk by changing its packaging. In 1994, he and MMI joined forces with ADA Mideast to produce and market Moo Kooler, the first single-serve milk packaged in round, re-sealable plastic bottles. Today, there are more than 1 billion units of milk sold annually in plastic bottles. While at MMI,

he also led the formation of the first U.S. dairy cooperative to cooperative international business venture with Campina Melkunia of Holland. He also served as a leader in the formation of Dairy Farmers of America, the nation's largest dairy cooperative.

Don has been appointed to his second term of the Agricultural Technical Advisory Committee for Trade by U.S. Secretary of Agriculture and has received the Agriculture Future of America 2007 Leader in Agriculture award, is an honorary life director for the National Milk Producers Federation and received their Distinguished Service Award in 2006.

A native of Lorain County, Don has never forgotten his Ohio roots. He has served as the past chairman for the "Share the Vision Campaign" for the OSU College of FAES and as a member of the Board of Directors for the OSU Alumni Association. Don is a current member of the OSU FAES Vice President Advisory committee and the OSU President's Club. He's also a supporter of the Ohio 4-H program and the National 4-H Council.

Don and his wife reside in Missouri, and they have two children, Brian and John.

William Preston Stalter



William Preston Stalter has served Ohio's "green industry" for more than a quarter century as executive director of the Ohio Nursery & Landscape Association (ONLA) and has guided the nationally recognized organization to increased levels of service.

The Central Environmental Nursery Trade Show "CENTS" expanded under Bill's guidance and is now the best attended show of its kind in the country. In 2006, the show expanded to 1,300 booths occupied by 60 firms from 38 states, Canada and Austria with more than 12,700 attendees.

Bill has been instrumental in fostering ONLA's strong working relationship with OSU. The "CENTS" show is held annually in concert with OSU's Nursery Short Course. An original member of the Chadwick Arboretum Advisory Committee, president of the Ohio Plant Science Advisory Council and a member of the Vice President's Advisory Board in the College of FAES, Bill has been a leader in the noteworthy partnership with teaching. Under his leadership, the OSU Nursery and Landscape Horticulture Endowment was established, and he has been a supporter of OSU's Extension Nursery Landscape Turf team. Bill has served as president of the Nursery & Landscape Association Executives of North America, the Ohio Agricultural Council and is the current president of the Ohio Horticulture & Crop Science Council at OSU.

Bill and his wife Patty reside in Westerville and have four children, Scott, Dawn, Brian and Ildar.

Ohio Hall of Fame Breakfast Strata Recipe

Ingredients

½ loaf stale French bread
3-4 tablespoons of melted butter
1/3 cup shredded Swiss cheese
¼ cup shredded Monterey Jack cheese
Ham or Canadian bacon cut into strips or smaller pieces
8 eggs
1 ½ cups whole milk
1/4 cup semi sweet white Ohio wine
1/2 Tablespoons of D'joun mustard
3-4 sliced green onions
Dash of red pepper
Dash of salt

Directions

Butter the bottom of a 9 x 13 glass baking dish, tear the bread into pieces and spread over the bottom. Sprinkle with the melted butter.

Begin layering with shredded Swiss cheese, shredded Monterey Jack cheese, the ham or Canadian bacon.

Whip together the eggs, milk, white wine, mustard, green onions, red pepper and salt. Pour over the bread, cheese and ham. Cover with foil, let sit overnight if possible or for a few hours to let the bread soak up the egg batter.

Bake for one hour at 350°. Remove from the oven, uncover, spread with 3/4 cup sour cream and sprinkle with Parmesan cheese.

Return to the oven uncovered just to brown or put under the broiler for a minute or two. Remove from oven and let sit for 5 minutes.

Cut in squares like lasagna for serving. Serves 12-15

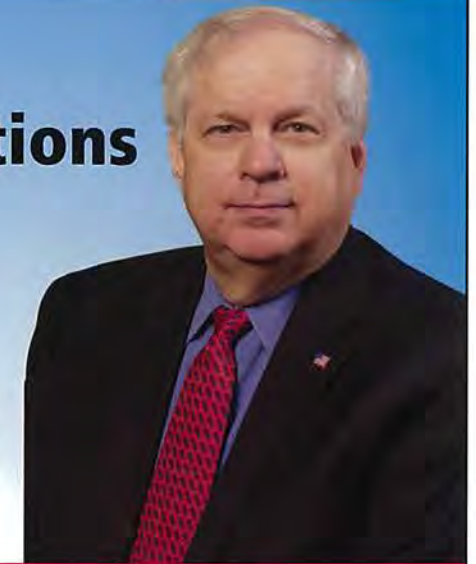
