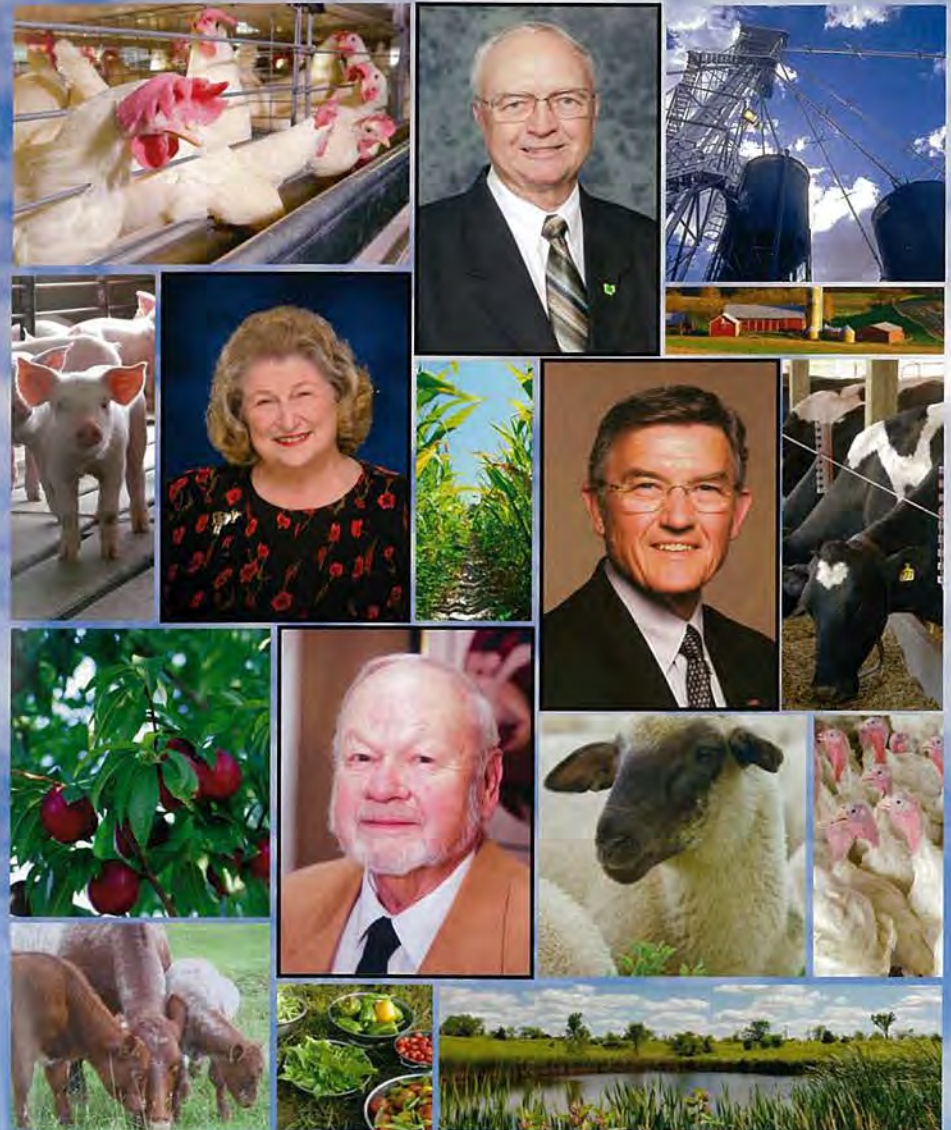

Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame

Created by the Ohio Agricultural Council in 1966, the Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame has now honored more than 200 agriculturists who have dedicated their lives of outstanding work to Ohio's number one industry, agriculture.

Member Meetings

The Ohio Agricultural Council holds two meetings per year at various central Ohio venues and features educational and entertaining guest speakers. The meetings are open to members and guests.

Youth Education

The Ohio Agricultural Council is a proud supporter of the Ohio Livestock Coalition's youth education program called For Your InFARmation (FYI). Designed to help third-grade students better understand where their food comes from, FYI focuses on how Ohio livestock farmers help feed our communities, our state and our world. All FYI materials can be downloaded free-of-charge at www.ForYourInFARmation.com.

Scholarship Program

OAC annually offers scholarships to assist students in pursuing a career in agriculture. Scholarships are available to high school seniors preparing to enter college or any undergraduate student currently enrolled in college. Applicants or their parent or legal guardian must be a resident of Ohio.

Scholarships are selected based on academic record, leadership qualities, community involvement, references and responses to application essay questions. Scholarship recipients are also provided a one-year complimentary student membership in the Council.

AGRICULTURAL HALL OF FAME

Enshrinement in the Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame is Ohio's highest recognition of an individual who has made outstanding contributions to the agricultural industry. Each year four prominent agricultural leaders are honored and inducted into the Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame for their superior service, dedication, leadership and plentiful contributions to agriculture.

NOMINATION AND SELECTION PROCESS

Persons wishing to nominate an individual who he or she believes is deserving of consideration for induction into the Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame may secure a nomination form by calling 614-794-8970; emailing info@ohioagcouncil.org or writing to the Ohio Ag Council, 5950 Sharon Woods Blvd, Columbus, Ohio 43229. Nomination forms, along with three letters of recommendation, must be submitted by March 29, 2013, in order to be eligible for consideration in 2013.

Three to five members including a former inductee are asked to serve as the Hall of Fame selection committee. In order to retain a high degree of integrity, the identity of the members of the selection committee is kept in confidence and precautions are taken to avoid the possibility of an individual serving on the selection committee more than one time.

2012 HONOREES

Dr. Charles W. Lifer



The Ohio 4-H program would not be the excellent program it is without **Dr. Charles Lifer's** extraordinary contributions, visionary leadership, wisdom, hard work, and personal commitment. A native of Knox County, he began his service to The Ohio State University Extension nearly 50 years ago as a county extension agent, and has earned a national reputation for his positive efforts to improve and expand the 4-H program.

Under his leadership, Dr. Lifer has doubled 4-H membership, restructured the Ohio 4-H Foundation to involve more key executives, quadrupled the Ohio 4-H Endowment Fund, and initiated the first 4-H Center on a land-grant university campus. In addition, he has provided leadership for numerous state and national committees.

Dr. Lifer is one of those rare individuals who continually and consistently makes an extraordinarily positive difference "behind the scenes." His advice and counsel is sought, valued and used by people from experienced government and university officials to the newest teen 4-H ambassadors. The advice and mentorship he has provided for agricultural leaders has made a tremendous difference in the quality and scope of programs throughout Ohio and the nation.

He has been inducted into the Ohio State 4-H Hall of Fame, as well as National 4-H Hall of Fame. He's also served as program chair and president of the Ohio State Ag. Retirees Association.

He and his wife Gwyenna reside in Columbus and have three children.

Dr. Bobby D. Moser



Dr. Bobby Moser has served as the vice president for Agricultural Administration and dean of the College of Food, Agricultural and Environmental Sciences at The Ohio State University for 20 years. Under his leadership, he has achieved many things, including: a more than 200-percent increase in grant awards, the issuance of more than 86 patents, the establishment of the Food Innovation Center, and the building of the Nationwide and Ohio Farm Bureau 4-H Center.

In 2005, Moser's leadership in global agricultural development was recognized in his appointment by then President George W. Bush and Indian Prime Minister Manmohan Singh to the US-India Knowledge Initiative on Agricultural Education, Teaching, Research, Service and Commercial Linkages.

Originally from Oklahoma, Dr. Moser has devoted his entire life to the betterment of agriculture – from his service to his local community to his contributions to national issues. His outstanding character, uncompromising integrity, and his passion for Ohio agriculture are unwavering.

He has received numerous accolades, including recognitions from the Ohio Cattlemen's Association, Ohio Farm Bureau Federation and the Ohio Produce Growers & Marketers Association.

He has served in a multitude of leadership positions from state to international levels including roles on the National Association of State Universities and Land Grant Universities, the W.K. Kellogg Foundation and the U.S. Pork Center of Excellence.

He and his wife Pat have two children, Mitch and Brannon and live in Dublin.

2012 HONOREES

Dr. Donald Karl Myers



For more than 30 years, **Dr. Donald Myers** has served The Ohio State University College of Food, Agricultural, and Environmental Sciences as an extension agent, state extension specialist, and member of the teaching and research faculty. His expertise in forage production has had a tremendous impact on agriculture and livestock production through increased efficiency and productivity.

Myers, known by many as the "father of no-till forages in Ohio" or "alfalfa specialist," was instrumental in the development of the innovative no-tillage forage seeding system, which has received worldwide recognition. In addition, Myers has authored more than 50 publications distributed through the nation to assist farmers in improving forage productivity.

His integrity and honesty have earned him unparalleled respect with farmers, the retail trade industry, and his professional peers. Even now in retirement, Myers continues to work as a tireless educator and advocate of conservation practices to further improve Ohio agriculture.

Dr. Myers has been awarded the National Certified Alfalfa Seed Council Educator of the Year twice and was inducted into the Farm Science Review Hall of Fame.

He was active in the early development of the Farm Science Review, as well as serving numerous roles in the American Society of Agronomy and the Malabar Farm Foundation Board.

He and his wife Marilyn live in Dover and have three children.

Micki Zartman



Micki Zartman's academic training in child development and her avocation to promote agricultural literacy have culminated in programs that inform and inspire a new generation of leaders and innovators. She spearheaded the formation of dairy farm tours for school children at OSU.

As a result, she took her enthusiasm to a new level and founded Scarlet and Gray Ag Day at OSU in 1999. SGAD is an outreach program designed to bring elementary students from surrounding schools to campus to learn

about the industry and opportunities within agriculture. This last year more than 650 students were hosted at the event, with more than 200 OSU students being involved.

Most recently, Zartman has been working to expand the involvement of Ohio high school students in the World Food Prize Youth Institute, further changing the way young people engage and act with issues of food security.

Zartman's ongoing devotion to the agriculture community cannot be measured in hours or programs, but by the students, teachers and community members she has touched and transformed with her enthusiasm, desire for excellence, and passion for agriculture.

She has been honored by numerous OSU affiliated clubs and organizations for her dedication to enhancing awareness of and appreciation for the agricultural industry, including receiving OSU's Distinguished Service award and Ohio Farm Bureau's Agriculture Educator award.

Originally from New Mexico, she was active in several organizations including the UNICEF and the Las Cruces' Jr. Women's Club.

She and her husband David reside in Worthington. They have two children.

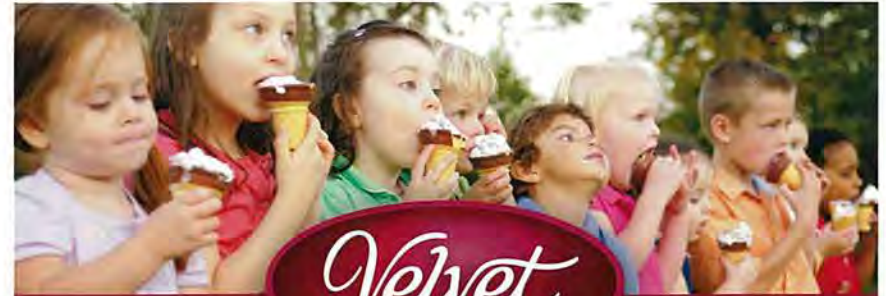

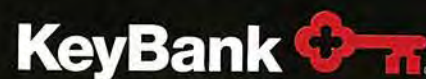

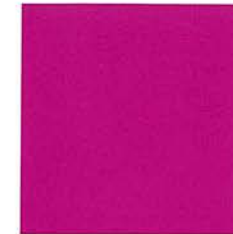
