Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame

Created by the Ohio Agricultural Council in 1966, the Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame has now honored more than 200 agriculturists who have dedicated their lives of outstanding work to Ohio's number one industry, agriculture.

Member Meetings

The Ohio Agricultural Council holds two meetings per year at various central Ohio venues and features educational and entertaining guest speakers. The meetings are open to members and guests.

Youth Education

The Ohio Agricultural Council is a proud supporter of the Ohio Livestock Coalition's youth education program called For Your InFARmation (FYI). Designed to help third-grade students better understand where their food comes from, FYI focuses on how Ohio livestock farmers help feed our communities, our state and our world. All FYI materials can be downloaded free-of-charge at www.ForYourInFARmation.com.

Scholarship Program

OAC annually offers scholarships to assist students in pursuing a career in agriculture. Scholarships are available to high school seniors preparing to enter college or any undergraduate student currently enrolled in college. Applicants or their parent or legal guardian must be a resident of Ohio.

Scholarships are selected based on academic record, leadership qualities, community involvement, references and responses to application essay questions. Scholarship recipients are also provided a one-year complimentary student membership in the Council.

Agricultural Hall of Fame

Enshrinement in the Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame is Ohio's highest recognition of an individual who has made outstanding contributions to the agricultural industry. Each year up to four prominent agricultural leaders are honored and inducted into the Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame for their superior service, dedication, leadership and plentiful contributions to agriculture.

Nomination and Selection Process

Persons wishing to nominate an individual who he or she believes is deserving of consideration for induction into the Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame may secure a nomination form by calling 614-794-8970; emailing info@ohioagcouncil.org or writing to the Ohio Ag Council, 5950 Sharon Woods Blvd, Columbus, Ohio 43229. Nomination forms, along with three letters of recommendation, must be submitted by March 31, 2014, in order to be eligible for consideration in 2014.

Three to five members including a former inductee are asked to serve as the Hall of Fame selection committee. In order to retain a high degree of integrity, the identity of the members of the selection committee is kept in confidence and precautions are taken to avoid the possibility of an individual serving on the selection committee more than one time.

2013 Honorees

Shirley Dunlap Bowser



A seventh-generation farmer, **Shirley Dunlap Bowser** has spent her entire life advocating for and promoting the advancement of Ohio food and agriculture at the community, state, and national levels. Bowser served nine years on the Board of Trustees of The Ohio State University, including a term as chairperson and has been awarded the Distinguished Service Award by the University.

On a national and international level, from 1986-2007, Bowser served on the W. K. Kellogg Foundation Board of Trustees, one of the world's largest private philanthropic organizations dedicated to improving health, agriculture and education. She also was appointed to two terms on the non-partisan National Agricultural Research, Extension, Education and Economics Advisory Board by the Secretary of Agriculture. Mrs. Bowser's community and state involvement includes past service on the board of the Ohio 4-H Foundation. Her past civic activities and memberships also include the Recreation and Resources Commission of the Ohio Department of Natural Resources, the Pickaway County Soil and Water Conservation District, the Pickaway County Planning Commission and the Central Ohio Water Council.

Bowser's leadership experiences and passion for philanthropy were a driving force in the creation of the Pickaway County Community Foundation, which currently holds assets near \$5 million dollars, holds over 60 endowed funds, of which three have a specific agricultural focus.

She and her husband, Cliff, live in Williamsport and have two grown children.

Louis M. "Mick" Colvin



Louis M. "Mick" Colvin has made significant contributions to the agricultural industry as a herdsman, farm manager, fieldman, brand creator and beef marketer. During his four decades of service to Ohio agriculture, he has shown great vision and integrity in the creation of the Certified Angus Beef® brand. Serving as the first executive director, Colvin led Ohio to become home of the nation's number-one branded beef marketing program. During his tenure, sales grew to nearly 500 million pounds per year. Today, more than 811 million pounds are marketed through the world. Today Certified Angus Beef® brand is world-renowned, served at thousands of restaurants and offered in thousands of meat cases.

An authority on branding, Colvin helped launch and teach the Branded Meats Products course at Ohio State in 2000. It is part of the College's new meats curriculum today.

Colvin has been a leader in the beef industry serving as past president and chairman of the Board for the Ohio Angus Association, on several boards for the Ohio and National Cattlemen's Associations, and as a consultant to organizations including Veal USA.

Colvin's leadership and dedication to agriculture has been widely recognized over the years. In 2009, Colvin was inducted into the Saddle & Sirloin Portrait Gallery and he was awarded the Outstanding Alumni Award from Penn State, College of Agricultural Sciences in 2010.

Colvin and his wife, Virginia, live in West Salem. They are the parents of two children.

2013 Honorees

Bernard J. Scott



Bernard J. Scott has dedicated more than 37 years to the advancement of agriculture by teaching hundreds of students through agricultural education at Otsego High School. He also helped convert the agriscience curriculum into semester courses that were taught by subject matter. A few years later, that same change was made statewide.

Always looking to the future, Scott and his FFA chapter constructed the FFA Time Capsule that was opened at the 75th FFA Convention. He also advised his students in the design and construction of the first "grain rescue tube" that was available for the public to use.

After retiring from teaching, he helped establish the Agricultural Incubator Foundation to facilitate research and educational activities for the advancement of the industry. Since the creation of this Foundation, numerous opportunities have been made available to residents with entrepreneurial ideas for food and agriculture.

Scott has given service to the Wood Soil & Water Conservation District, the National FFA proficiency awards, Washington Twp. Volunteer Fire Department, Town & Country Farm Safety Day camp, Ohio Vocational Association, Ohio Education Association and numerous Wood county organizations.

He has been awarded the Distinguished Alumni award from OSU, College of FAES, the Ohio State Alumni Citizenship award and the Honorary American Degree.

He resides with his wife, Jean in Tontogeny. They have seven children.

Doug White



A third-generation farmer, **Doug White** continues to manage a livestock and crop operation with his family. His career as a public servant has included six years as county commissioner, a member of the Ohio House of Representatives for six years, and a member of the Ohio Senate for eight years. During his time in the Ohio Senate, White served as the Chair of the Agriculture Committee and Finance Committee, as well as Senate President. He also served as the Director of the Ohio Department of Commerce for Governor Bob Taft.

As an elected official, White used his agricultural background to guide him through the decision making process. In his many years of public service, White consistently worked to make a positive impact on policy changes and supported the adequate funding necessary to ensure Ohio agriculture remained strong. He also supported conservation programs and practices carried out by the Ohio Department of Natural Resources and the state's Soil and Water Conservation Districts.

White currently serves on the Ohio Expositions Commission Board and works to promote the Ohio 4-H program, strengthen the presence of commodity groups, and continually advocate for agricultural education at the Ohio State Fair. He also has served as president of the Ohio Cattlemen's Association and a member of the Ohio Beef Council.

He has been inducted into the Department of Animal Science Hall of Fame at Ohio State, been awarded the Meritorious Service Award from OSU and Outstanding Service awards from both Ohio University and Miami University.

He and his wife Shirley, reside in Manchester. They are the parents of two children.

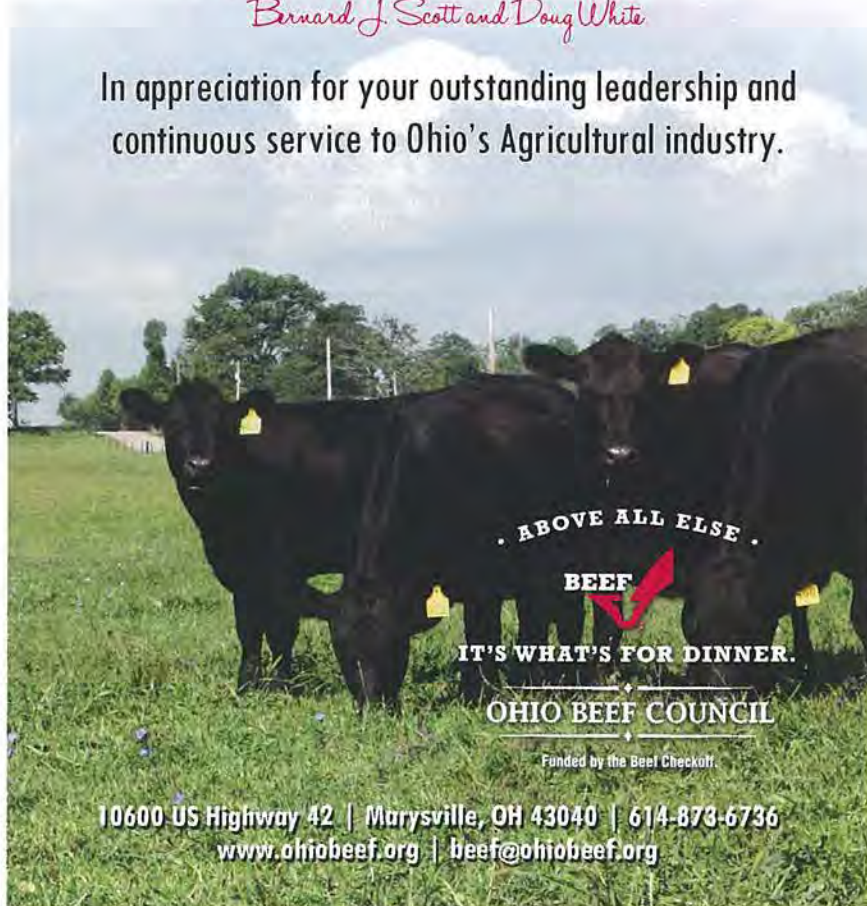

Through PGI, a hog marketing organization, Bell Farms Ag LLC has utilized United Producers Inc.'s (UPI) Advanced Hog Marketing and risk management services to market their hogs.

"Being able to market our hogs the way we have, has been a good thing for us," said Matt Bell.

UPI has a team of people negotiating contracts with packers and monitoring the livestock and grain markets for the Bells.

"It's helpful to have someone who calls and tells you what you should do," said Matt. "The markets can change so quickly, so the stakes are so great," said Irv Bell.

"When we have United Producers watching out for us, it allows us to concentrate on production," said Matt.

With the help of UPI and PGI, Bell Farms Ag LLC has grown and expanded to a sixth-generation farm.

"Without PGI and UPI, we would not have the numbers or leverage to negotiate with packers by ourselves," said Matt.
