Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame

Created by the Ohio Agricultural Council in 1966, the Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame has now honored more than 200 agriculturists who have dedicated their lives of outstanding work to Ohio's number one industry, agriculture.

Induction into the Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame is Ohio's highest recognition of an individual who has made outstanding contributions to the agricultural industry. Each year up to four prominent agricultural leaders are honored and inducted into the Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame for their superior service, dedication, leadership and plentiful contributions to agriculture.

Nomination and Selection Process

Persons wishing to nominate an individual who he or she believes is deserving of consideration for induction into the Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame may secure a nomination form by calling 614-794-8970; emailing info@ohioagcouncil.org or writing to the Ohio Ag Council, 5950 Sharon Woods Blvd, Columbus, Ohio 43229. Nomination forms, along with three letters of recommendation, must be submitted by March 31, 2015, in order to be eligible for consideration in 2015.

Three to five members including a former inductee are asked to serve as the Hall of Fame selection committee. In order to retain a high degree of integrity, the identity of the members of the selection committee is kept in confidence and precautions are taken to avoid the possibility of an individual serving on the selection committee more than one time.

Bernard (Bernie) Heisner has been a dedicated leader to Ohio agriculture, most notably in the dairy industry. Since 1993, Heisner served as general manager for COBA/Select Sires, Inc. retiring in 2013. During his tenure, he has transformed the cooperative into a progressive leader, helping farmers improve their herds, milk production and income through outstanding genetic and bloodline selection.

Heisner has been an active leader in the dairy industry through his involvement in the Ohio Livestock Coalition, Ohio Agricultural Council, Ohio Dairy Producers Association, and National Dairy Shrine. He also has been an ardent supporter of The Ohio State University's College of Food, Animal and Environmental Sciences and 4-H judging programs.

Heisner has been recognized by the industry for his leadership and service many times throughout his career. His motto, "What does it take to get it done and how can I help make it happen?," has left a powerful imprint on the dairy industry that will continue for years to come.

Terry Pohlman grew up on a farm raising crops and livestock with his dad and brother. After working off the farm, he started his own farm. "I started with nothing, got a loan and have been operating ever since," said Pohlman.

Pohlman took advantage of UPI services to help his farm thrive. **"I can market my livestock, get a loan and hedge my cattle all under one roof. It really works well."**

Over time Pohlman became more aggressive using several Commodity Marketing Solutions risk management services.

"At first I was intimidated, but once I overcame a learning curve, I became more confident in expanding the products I was using. Other companies do not have the trading options and futures like UPI."

"I especially like using the Feeders Preference contracts, because it gives you a little wiggle room. **Having UPI carry some of the margin calls and provide this service has helped me manage my risk and protect my operation,**" said Pohlman.

Pohlman also uses UPI's Credit Services and livestock marketing. "The credit staff is knowledgeable and understands the livestock business and why I need the money for my farm. My loan officer comes to my house, and I get personal interaction."

"UPI has a good pool of people to source cattle, coordinate trucking, and negotiate pricing on my behalf. When the cattle walk off the truck, they are how UPI says they will be," Pohlman said. **UPI has the farmer's best interests in mind and is not trying to line their own pockets."**

William Hoewischer, Sr.

Sidney, Ohio

William (Bill) Hoewischer, Sr. now deceased, worked for more than 60 years as a farmer and livestock breeder in Ohio. He was nationally known as a breeder and exhibitor of registered livestock, specifically for Belgian horses, Yorkshire and Hampshire hogs, and Shorthorn beef cattle.

Through his career, Hoewischer tirelessly gave his time and resources to the livestock industry by serving on the Producers Livestock Association (now United Producers, Inc.) Board, National Livestock and Meat Board, Farm Credit District Bank Board, and as the superintendent of the beef cattle at the Ohio State Fair.

He was recognized nationally for his achievements and contributions. In 1993, Hoewischer received the Ohio Farm Bureau Federation's Distinguished Service Award, the organization's highest honor, for his outstanding contributions to his local community and the industry of agriculture at the state and national levels.

Hoewischer was well respected by individuals he worked with and served, and was looked to as a strong leader in the agriculture industry.

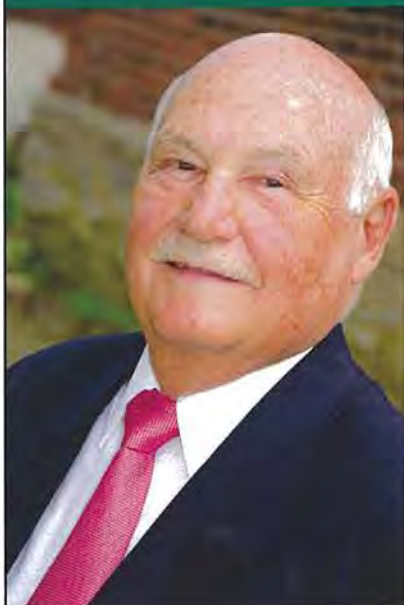
