OHIO AG HALL OF FAME

Created by the Ohio Agricultural Council in 1966, the Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame has now honored more than 240 agriculturists who have dedicated their lives of outstanding work to Ohio's number-one industry, agriculture.

Induction into the Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame is Ohio's highest recognition of an individual who has made outstanding contributions to the agricultural industry. Each year, up to four prominent agricultural leaders are honored and inducted into the Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame for their superior service, dedication, leadership and plentiful contributions to agriculture.

NOMINATION AND SELECTION

Persons wishing to nominate an individual who he or she believes is deserving of consideration for induction into the Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame may download a nomination form by visiting <u>ohioagcouncil.org/hall-of-fame</u>. Nomination forms, along with three letters of recommendation, must be submitted by March 15, 2023, in order to be eligible for consideration in 2023.

Three to five members, including a former inductee, are asked to serve as the Hall of Fame selection committee. In order to retain a high degree of integrity, the identity of the members of the selection committee is kept in confidence and precautions are taken to avoid the possibility of an individual serving on the selection committee more than one time.

HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE



DR. LEON W. BOUCHER

A pioneer for agricultural education, Leon Boucher, Ph.D. left his mark in many countries across the globe through his development of teacher training programs in agriculture. His work with the U.S. Agency for International Development stretched from the U.S. to India, Sierra Leone, Swaziland, Sri Lanka and Lesotho.

In 1944, Boucher left his home of Green Springs, Ohio, to serve in the U.S. Navy, becoming a distinguished and decorated veteran for his services in WWII. He returned to work for The Ohio State University and Hilliard High School in 1950 where he was an educator at the Student Teacher Training Center and Vocational Agriculture Program. Boucher then taught as an assistant professor for Ohio State while he earned his Ph.D. in 1964. He remained at Ohio State as a professor overseeing recruitment and the agricultural education student teacher program until his retirement in 1986.

Boucher mentored hundreds of undergraduate and graduate students equipping them with the tools and knowledge they needed to succeed as agricultural educators. An agriculturalist to his core, Boucher's impact on the industry spans far, wide and deep, paving the way for today's agricultural educators.





STEVE DRAKE

Establishing, building and growing many agricultural organizations throughout Ohio and the country, Steve Drake is well known for sharing encouragement, wisdom and lessons learned throughout his career. His vision and leadership had a profoundly significant impact on the industry through initiatives that impacted soybean farmers, Christmas tree growers and many more. Drake's nonprofit efforts generated millions of dollars to support Monsanto's 1993 flood relief program and more than 122,000 military families through the National Christmas Tree Association's Christmas SPIRIT Foundation and Trees for Troops program.

Drake was also active in agricultural communications, collaborating with the U.S. Farmers and Ranchers Alliance, Farm Bureau, Agricultural Relations Council and National Agri-Marketing Association as well as establishing the now annual Ag Media Summit through the American Agricultural Editors' Association, Livestock Publications Council and the Agricultural Publishers Association. Seeing challenges as opportunities and potential in everyone he met, Drake's forward-looking mindset and vision for the future made him a dedicated and innovative leader in the industry.

Her fierce dedication and tenacity advocating for the underserved, and building meaningful, lasting relationships and resolutions has led her to become a prominent figure in the anti-hunger movement near and far.


